## **About Klang Special School**

#### Selangor Association for Mentally Handicapped (SAMH) Objectives

Our objectives are to initiate programs in order to improve the quality of life of children and adults with learning disabilities. We hope that they will achieve the following :-

- To become useful citizens
- To be independent
- To be able to hold a Job
- To be aware of Health and Safety rules
- To be able to contribute to society
- To have good moral values
- To be creative, enterprising, skilled in information and communication technology

#### Introduction

Funding for orphaned and care home young people as well as students with disabilities and handicap's in Malaysia is generally quite low. Sadly some of the orphaned students living in care homes are no longer able to attend Klang School as their care homes cannot afford the fees. Currently Klang School have around 30 orphan and disability young people aged from 3 years – 25 years unable to attend for that very reason.

#### **Programs Offered**

#### Early Intervention Program

This program sees some of the youngest students with handicaps and disabilities being able to engage in meaningful educational programs. The target Group - 6 years and below

- School hours - 3 times a week for 2 hours.

- 1 hour individual learning and 1 hour group activities.
- The role of the parent / guardian is to follow up the program at home

#### School Program

The school program consists of education, arts & crafts, gardening, swimming and cooking. The target Group - 7 to 17 years

The students are put into 4 Levels :

Level 1 - (7-9 years)

- Level 2 (10-12 years)
- Level 3 (13-14 years)

Level 4 - ( 15-17 years )

Behavior management programs are carried out as and when necessary. School sessions are Monday to Friday

- morning session : 08:00am - 01:00pm

- afternoon session : 12:30noon - 05:30pm

#### Vocational Training Centre

The target Group – 18 years and above who take part in vocational activities including:

- Sewing
- Handicraft
- Living skills
- Academic (Mathematics, Malay, English and Social Moral)

Other activities – Swimming, Computer Skills, Recreational Activities, Chess Club, Horse Riding, Educational Outings and Sports. There is a recent addition of a market garden that is helping the school to be self sufficient with food of their own as well as selling to external sources.

#### Sheltered Workshop

This allows the more adult learners with disabilities have employment in a safe environment. The target group are trainees who have completed the vocational training program. There is a probation period –of 3 months

Work includes :

- Assembling
- Packaging
- Labeling
- Sorting
- Quality Control
- loading / unloading of goods

For a student to be able to attend Klang Schools educational programs it costs 4,800RM (Malaysian Ringgits) per annum, which equates to approximately \$1,600. This gets the students 1 year's education, all their meals throughout the day and uniform. You can make a difference to their lives through any of the following:


Donations in Malaysia can be made through Klang Apex Club's trust account for student sponsorship. Klang Apex Club have worked with the special school since the 1980's.
